The Lord's Prayer

Matthew 6:9, Luke 11:2.

This portion of scripture that we know so well as the Lord's prayer is an example of the type of prayer that Christians should pray. In Luke 11:1 the disciples asked Jesus "Lord, teach us to pray." They had seen the fervent prayer life of the master and desired to pray the same way.

In this sample prayer Jesus covered 6 areas or parts of a complete prayer.

1. Praise and Adoration
2. Submission
3. Petition
4. Repentance
5. Forgiveness
6. Back to Praise and Thanksgiving

Jesus was teaching his disciples how to pray using these 6 parts of prayer. The first part of prayer should always be praise and adoration unto God.

Ps 100:4 (KJV) "Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name."

Psalms 22 tells that God inhabits the praises of Israel or in other words his people. Can you remember a time that you didn't particularly feel like praying but you began to praise the Lord? What happened?
